#### Cruise Types:

Temperatures in June to August are pleasant - around 20°C, but by Autumn the temperatures have dropped to the mid teens.

#### Cape Liberty

Just three miles from Newark Liberty International Airport, Cape Liberty Cruise Port is located on the New York Harbour in Bayonne, New Jersey. Its waterfront location and convenience to the Big Apple allows visitors easy access to New York City.

#### Newport

Rhode Island, the smallest state of the Union at a mere 48 miles long by 37 miles wide, is home to more than twenty percent of the nation's historical landmarks. The restored Old Port Exchange near the quay-side, between Exchange and Pearl, is entertaining, with all sorts of red-brick antique shops, specialist book and music stores.

#### Halifax

Halifax is the capital city of Nova Scotia. The city has a rich maritime history being one of the world's great natural harbours, and an entry point for European immigration to Canada in the 19th and 20th centuries. The Citadel, an old British fortress with a striking white clock tower, is the town's focal point and most significant sight.

#### Quebec

Quebec City is Canada's most beautifully located and historic city. Vieux-Québec, surrounded by solid fortifications, is the only walled city in North America, a fact that prompted UNESCO to classify it as a World Heritage Treasure in 1985. In both parts of the Old City - Haute and Basse - the winding cobbled streets are flanked by seventeenth- and eighteenth-century stone houses and churches, graceful parks and squares, and countless monuments.

#### Boston

Boston's place in American history alone makes it worth a visit. To get a good perspective of the city's layout and history, take a walking tour along the Freedom Trail. Boston is more than history though, the shopping is phenomenal, and visitors should be sure to visit Faneuil Hall Marketplace, which has a history dating back 250 years. A host of Boston museums warrant a visit or for an escape to nature, take in Boston Common, one of the oldest public parks in the United States.
