Minimum: 2 pax</p> <p>Our first encounter is with a visit to EITHER the late Damara chief, Mr. Augustinus Garoeb’s family or Naftaline, a wonderful Herero lady who shares her knowledge on her culture and traditions. From there we continue on foot through the streets of Mondesa taking the opportunity to chat with the local people and getting a fascinating glimpse into a typical Namibian township. If we have time and he is available we stop briefly at Mr. Stanley Witbooi’s house to learn about Nama traditions and herbal medicines. Then we hop back into the vehicle and drive out to the Democratic Resettlement Community (DRC). Daytime tour stops to visit a local kindergarten (crèche). Evening tour, we share a cup of fresh mint tea at ERNST & ELSIE’S house. Time for a drink and culinary discoveries, we stop at a local Shebeen where TASHA & Co will host you, Ovambo style! Swakopmund, deriving its name from the fact that it lies at the mouth of the Swakop River, is an oasis, neatly nestled between the wild Atlantic Ocean and the world’s most ancient sea of sand, the Namib Desert</p> <p>This tour has no set time and lasts for as little as 60 min. The tour takes you through the old part of town, revealing its historic buildings giving you a sense of being in old Germany. Concentrating on landmark buildings and sites one understands how Swakopmund became to be and how life was created in this endless stretch of dessert. Leaving the old part of town behind and exploring the suburbs growing around town, one becomes aware how big, diverse and ever changing this charming coastal city really is. <p>Harbour Dolphin Cruise 3hrs</p>	<p>3 hour boat cruise, including oysters, snacks and sparkling wine Minimum: 2 pax</p> <p>Cruise departs Walvis Bay Yacht club at 09h00 and takes you through the harbour to Bird Island, you then cut across the lagoon to the moored Russian trawlers where inquisitive seals will swim up to the boats looking for something to eat. From there we head to Pelican Point where entertainment is provided by a large seal colony and pods of Heavyside and Bottlenose Dolphins swimming alongside the boats. For bird lovers, apart from seeing flamingoes, cormorants and pelicans, there are common sightings of the White Chinned Petrel, Wilson’s Storm Petrel, Black Oystercatcher and even the Jackass Penguin. <p>Namib Desert Tour Full Day</p>	<p>7 hour tour, including a picnic lunch Minimum: 4 pax</p> <p>Come and discover life in this desolate landscape that is the Namib Desert. Follow remote tracks and experience interesting adaptations of the fauna and flora. Depart Swakopmund at 09h00 and enjoy a spectacular scenic drive taking you between the magnificent sand dune and awe-inspiring Atlantic Ocean. Arriving in Walvis Bay, we head for the Walvis Bay lagoon and international wetland. Here you will be able to observe the majestic greater- and lesser flamingos that abound in this area. Next we head off to the Walvis Bay Salt Works and then Dune 7, the highest dune in the area. Here we stop for a picnic lunch and a leisurely climb up the dune to witness first hand the magnificent view. After lunch, our tour takes us behind the dune belt and we go in search of the White Lady Spider, the elusive Palmetto Gecko, the Desert Side Winder and Aporosaura Sand Diving Lizard. The tour then takes us further into the Namib Naukluft Park, through the gravel plains to the Moonlandscape, past Oasis Goanikontes up the Swakop Riverbed to the living fossil, the Welwitschia Mirabilis plant. <p>Namib Desert Tour Half Day</p>	<p>Half Day Tour including refreshment drinks Minimum: 3 pax</p> <p>On first glance it seems impossible that the arid desert can support life. Yet it holds some of the richest lichen fields in the world and these lichens take on deeply colored hues in the morning light. We depart Swakopmund at either 09h00 or 14h00 to return at either 13h00 or 18h00 respectively. We travel to the Moon Landscape, where soft overlaying levels of earth, deposited some million years ago, were eroded to create this eerie crater filled area. In 1859 a botanist searching the Namib Desert found, what he later described “as the world’s strangest plant”. This trip goes in search of these “living fossils” the Welwitschia Mirabilis a botanic curiosity endemic to the Namib Desert and one of the most bizarre and intriguing plants on earth</p>	<p>Min 3 pax</p>	<p>R644.00</p>

<p>Cape Cross Seal Colony Tour</p>	<p>5 hour tour. Minimum: 2 pax including refreshment drinks Depart Swakopmund at either 09h00 or 13h00 and return at either 13h00 or 17h00 respectively. In 1486 Diego Cao landed on the coast of Namibia at Cape Cross. Here, 115-km north of Swakopmund, he erected a cross in honor of King John 1 of Portugal. Today a replica of Diego Cao's cross can be seen at the Cape Cross. But that's not all - Cape Cross is one of the largest breeding seal colonies in southern Africa, fluctuating in numbers of about between 80 000 – 300 000 seals. Come and enjoy a trip to Cape Cross with an experienced guide. En route we visit Mile 4 Salt Pans to view the Flamingos, Wlotkas Baken and Henties Bay.</p>	<p>2 pax R1,182.00</p>	<p>3 pax R788.00</p>
<p>Dune Desert (Living Desert Tour)</p>	<p>4 - 5 hour tour. Minimum: 2 pax This half-day tour departs from Swakopmund at 08h00 and lasts 4 – 5 hours. The tour concentrates on exploring the local dune belt between Walvis Bay and Swakopmund. Special care is taken not to damage the gravel plains and cause unnecessary damage to the dune eco system. Your guide will stop continuously to look for tracks (know locally as reading the bushman newspaper), to determine which animals were active the previous night and wherever possible will try to catch some of them to show you. Great care is taken in sharing knowledge with you on each desert animal and plant, including emphasis on special adaptations and perfect design used for survival in the desert.</p>	<p>Min 2 pax</p>	<p>R619.00</p>



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Sandboarding Swakopmund	<p>Minimum: 2 pax Trips depart at 09h30 and return at 12h30. Rates include a light lunch, transfers and refreshments.</p> <p>Lie down sand boarding - no experience necessary. The sand boarder lies on their stomach shooting head first down the dune. After a brief instruction period we head up the dune for our first ride which we call Little Nellie. This ride makes a gentle arc down the dune and introduces the boarder to the feel of the rides and gives them practice in steering and stopping the board. From there we move to the second "training" ride called the Birgit Run. This ride is longer, steeper and faster than the first. Lizzie is the first of the real rides and the third ride on the dune. The boarder is now confident with reaching speeds up to 60 kph (37 mph). This ride also offers excellent photo opportunities. The Tandem toboggan is next. Each boarder picks a partner and we send them down a long gentle slope with one sitting in the front and one controlling the board from the back. The fastest ride on the dune is called Dizzy and comes right after the tandem. We put an extra layer of polish on the boards in order to reach the maximum speed of 80 kph (50 mph). People often choose to do this ride more than once. To finish the morning we slide back to the starting point via the Gentle Valley- a long steep ride that rounds off the morning nicely. Age Limit- The youngest kids that are confident on their own boards are 10 yrs and up. Younger kids are welcome to join the trip, but often choose to ride with guides on the faster rides.</p>	Min 2 pax	R282.00
