Two Oceans Aquarium With more than 3000 marine creatures on view – including sharks, turtles and penguins - the Two Oceans Aquarium is one of the finest aquariums in the world. It comprises of seven exhibition galleries with large viewing windows and allows you to discover the life of the Atlantic Ocean including rarities like the translucent jellyfish, Knysna seahorse and giant spider crabs. Walk to Freedom Tour Drive past the Slave Lodge and City Hall to view Mandela's Statue, site of the first ever public speech Nelson Mandela delivered after his release from prison. Visit the riveting District Six Museum and travel through the District Six Site for a sharp reminder of the past. Tour Langa Township, the oldest apartheid housing scheme in the Cape, visiting the local market - Gugu Sthebe, where the community showcase their skills and various projects including arts & craft. Thereafter continue to see the informal housing as well as new housing developments under way. With over 30 stops across 3 different routes, you'll have plenty of opportunities to hop off the bus and explore the Cape Town landmarks and attractions that appeal to you most. City Sightseeing Sunset Tour - Cape Town

The tour departs daily from stop 1 outside the Two Oceans Aquarium at the V&A Waterfront. Arrival time 30 min before the departure time. Use the 17:00 shuttle service from stop 5 in Long Street to connect to the Sunset Bus at stop 1 (outside the Two Oceans Aquarium at the V&A Waterfront).

The Sunset Bus is not a hop-on, hop-off tour like the other City Sightseeing tours but it does stop at Signal Hill to give passengers the opportunity to watch the sun set over the Atlantic Ocean. Over the festive season, on the return to the V&A Waterfront, the bus takes a drive down Adderley Street for locals and visitors to experience the delightful display of festive season lights.

The Authentic Cape Town City Tour

Take a cable car to the summit of the legendary Table Mountain, one of the Seven Wonders of the World, with views of the city and surrounding layout of this southernmost tip of Africa. Drive to Camps Bay, boasting a magnificent white sandy beach and once the hunting ground of Lord Charles Somerset. Wind your way along through Clifton, an exclusive residential area, home to some of the most expensive real estate in South Africa before meandering through Sea Point, the first commuter suburb of Cape Town and now a recognized Orthodox Jewish community. Enroute you'll see the sweeping silhouette of the Cape Town Stadium before passing down Adderley Street considered the main street of the central business district.

The City Hall located on the Grand Parade is next up. Nelson Mandela made his first public speech after his release from the balcony of Cape Town City Hall. Drive past the Castle of Good Hope, a Provisional Heritage Site. You're passing Charly's Bakery, home of Charly's Cake Angels, stars of the Food Network Show before hearing a brief history of District Six enroute to a visit at the Company Gardens. It's bordered by numerous landmarks including the Slave Lodge, present day Houses of Parliament and St George's Cathedral, the seat of the Anglican church in South Africa. Hear about Greenmarket Square, the location for the well that was once the town's main water supply during summer months when streams from Table Mountain dried up, before a visit to the Noon Gun where you witness the historic time signal. The history of the Bo-Kaap and its people as you move up the cobblestoned hills to the Malay Quarter, and marvel at the ice-cream colours of the quaint Bo-Kaap homes. Our final stop. A jewellery showroom where we meet a master diamond cutter and witness the process of cutting and polishing a diamond. You may even witness the pouring of a gold bar!

Cape Canopy Tour in the Elgin Valley Located in a World Heritage Site within CapeNature's Hottentots Holland Nature Reserve. Table Mountain Cableway The five-minute ascent to the top of Table Mountain offers a 360-degree view of Cape Town, the ocean and the neighbouring peaks. Once at the top visitors enjoy spectacular views and the peaceful feeling of being over one thousand meters above the city below. The area at the top of the mountain is surprisingly large so leave enough time to stroll along the paths, enjoy the viewing platforms and soak up the vistas. The Cableway operates in the Table Mountain National Park, an important part of the Cape Floristic Region and the single richest floristic area in the world. This area is also a World Heritage Site. There is a lot of Fynbos vegetation on the mountain, with over 1 460 different species of plants. and seaside suburbs of Clifton and Camps Bay – and further afield, Llandudno. You'll see Seal Island on your right, before crossing into Hout Bay and Chapman's Peak's unspoiled cove. Then you'll get to experience it all again, as you journey back along the Peninsula to the V&A Waterfront.
