Tour through the historic Rocks area and take in views of the Opera House, Hyde Park, St Mary's Cathedral, Parliament House and the Art Gallery. Stop at Mrs Macquarie's Chair for magnificent views of the Opera House and Harbour Bridge. Visit The Gap and enjoy stunning views. Stop at the world-famous Bondi Beach and enjoy the spectacular scenery. <p><b>Blue Mountains &amp; Australian Wildlife with River Cruise</b></p> <p>Discover the spectacular Blue Mountains and see native wildlife whilst you explore World Heritage-listed Blue Mountains National Park. Continue through historic North Adelaide. See tree-lined streets, mansions and historic buildings. Wind through hand-hewn tunnels, across bridges and curves, all the time appreciating what an amazing engineering feat it is. In Kuranda, it is time to explore this fascinating village. The Heritage Markets are full of colourful and interesting arts and crafts. You might also like to visit Birdworld, the Australian Butterfly Sanctuary or Kuranda Koala Gardens (own expense). Later, board the Skyrail Rainforest Cableway for your 7.5km journey over and through World Heritage protected rainforest to Smithfield. <p><b>Kakadu National Park Explorer</b> Kakadu National Park is a timeless place - a landscape of exceptional beauty and diversity. Mangrove fringed coastal areas blend into expansive flood plains, lowland hills flanked to the east by sandstone escarpments, all interwoven between various open woodland and forest habitats. Teeming with wildlife in the water, on the land and in the air, there are many species, which provide a diversity and concentration seen nowhere else. The land takes on different forms and different colours with the passing of each season.</p> <p>Travel across Adelaide River and Murrumbidgee Plains and deep into Kakadu National Park. There is the opportunity for an optional 50 minute scenic flight (SKF50 -own expense). Visit the Warradjan Cultural Centre and view the informative displays depicting the traditions of the Aboriginal people in Kakadu; we join our local guide for a cruise on the famous Yellow Water Billabong. Search for saltwater crocodiles and the colourful range of birdlife for which this region is renowned. <p><b>Wave Rock, York, Wildflowers &amp; Aboriginal Culture inc Lunch</b> Heading east we enjoy morning tea (own expense) at historic York, the first township founded in the Avon Valley. Visit the Dog Cemetery before arriving in Hyden. We then visit Hippo's Yawn, a rock formation that resembles a hippo yawning. Break for a Aussie country style lunch at the Wildflower Shop. We then move on to see the spectacle of Wave Rock and the ancient Gnamma Holes. Whilst here visit either a wildlife Park or view the unique Antique Lace Collection. Leaving Wave Rock, we visit The Humps and Mulka's Cave. We return to Perth via a different route and stop at the quaint country town of Babakin for afternoon tea prepared by the Country Women's Association (own expense). Stop to view colourful banks of wildflowers when in season (Sep-Nov, subject to Mother Nature).</p>	Daily	12.25 Hours	217 AUD
<p><b>Valley of the Giants Tree Top Walk Including Lunch</b> Travel South through Donnybrook, famous for its fruit orchards. Enjoy rolling farmlands of the Blackwood River Valley. Travel through Western Australia's old growth forest to see the 51m tall Diamond Tree Bush Fire watchtower. Climb it if you dare - the breath-taking views from the top are worth it. Alternatively, you can simply enjoy a picnic lunch in a tranquil bush setting. Then visit the Valley of the Giants 'Tree Top Walk'. Get up-close and personal with these 400-year-old giants of the southwest tingle forest region. Walk through the treetop canopy, along the gradually elevated walkway, suitable for all ages. The highest point of the 600-metre loop is about 40 metre. On the ground walk through Ancient Empire of wise girthed Tingle Trees up to 10 metres in diameter.
